At the invitation of Project

Professor Gareis visited to Beijing, Xi'an, Shanghai on schedule. He also issued lectures in the 3 mentioned cities for the seminars there, giving brief introductions on current events, relevant methods and the some focuses of research on project managements. More than 300 peoples involved in the seminars, most of them are senior project managers, experts from famous institutes of China.

• Visiting in Beijing

A serial of seminars were going from Dec.11 to Dec.13, 2003, in Beijing Friendship Hotel fro Prof. Gareis's lectures on PM. More than 20 experts from Ministry of Commerce of Peoples Republic of China, some foreign capital enterprises and some agencies of IPMP took part in the exchanging activities.



• Specail Trip in Xi'an

From 13 Dec. to 16Dec. professor Gareis processed special visiting in Xi'an. He visited to the North-western Polytechnic University (NWPU) where the headquarters of PMRC situates. Here Prof. Gareis and the leaders of PMRC and NWPU negotiated on reciprocally cooperation and came to a primary agreement on cooperating in research on Project Management, publication and exchanging students. Lecturing on the topic of "Project Management in the project-oriented organization" brought people some kind of new information on the key conception, the thought of the management oriented on project, and the achievement of his own research on this aspect. There was an exciting



atmosphere in the meeting place. Teachers and students who were majoring on or interested in project management from NWPU attending the lecture, many participators brought forward their question on the topic everybody got a possibly answer as well. The debate between Gareis and the participators on the interested points of view led an upsurge to the seminar. It was estimated there were more than 200 people in the enlisted in the meeting.

• Shanghai Seminar

From Dec.19 to Dec.21, 2003 Prof. Roland Gareis took part in the "2003-Shanghai-Senior Seminar on International Project Management with the general topic "Organizational Project Management of 21st Century" was ceremoniously held on schedule in Shanghai.



Prof. Roland Gareis made the speech on "Planning of Large-scaled Project and Program Management ", " Management of Project Portfolio and PM Office " and "Management of Project-oriented Company". He introduced his patent products "Maturity Model of Project Management for the Project-oriented Company" in details on the sides of its concerned theory and application status. Prof. Gareis explained his points of views with many practical cases. The participants had been encouraged to raise relevant questions based on their own situation. Thus not



only provided them with new knowledge, but also made them grasp the concept of those points of views through the extempore cases studying. The discussion was being carried out in a warm atmosphere. The participants mutually felt rich benefits from this three-day lecture.

How to use the development of a National Competence Baseline to promote the Project-Oriented Society

1. INTRODUKTION

A new National Competence Baseline on Project Management has been developed in the Danish Project Management Association during 2001-2002. The platform for the development was the IPMA Competence Baseline issued by IPMA, the International Project Management Association and the prime purpose of the new NCB is to be a tool for self-assessment in the IPMA 4 Level Certification Programme. The author of this paper has edited the tool in cooperation with a development team and a broad panel of core members of the association.


The paper describes briefly the contents of the self-assessment tool and how the development process and the final tool has been utilised to promote modern project management in the society.

2. CONTENTS OF THE NATIONAL COMPETENCE BASELINE

The tool consists of three parts reflecting the components of project management competencies:

When developing the tool we selected a structure and contents that fully covered the classic project management issues described in the International Competence Baseline. But we also included other aspects of project management with the purpose both to gain a practical tool for self-assessment and to influence the focus and perception of project management in the society:

• The model of the three project management competencies states that methods based and behaviour-based competencies are of *equal importance*.



Besides indicating this the overall model on the first page, this perception is supported by giving the selfassessment tools on methods and behaviour the same format.

- Further, methods and behaviour-based competencies should be integrated.
 Appropriate methods support appropriate behaviour and appropriate behaviour is a demand for benefiting from the methods. The hard and soft aspects of project management should be combined not seen and handled as two different issues, which for example are trained at different course modules.
- By structuring the methods based competencies we promote a process oriented approach, where project management efforts primarily are grouped according to processes performed in practice - and then secondarily according to project management disciplines and type of tools.
- In addition to the classic performance of overall and ongoing project management (Processes 3 and 4 on the figure) we have also focused on methods based competencies

concerning the management of the managerial processes. In addition of performing project management it is of increasing importance that project managers are competent in planning the project management in general and organising the project management phases (Processes 1 and 2 on the figure).


- Further, project managers need also to some degree to be competent on how to integrate the corporate project processes (Process 5 in the model). Both to be able to contribute to this form of individual projects and to assess the level of support gained from the corporation, and even requesting more professional interaction.
- When subdividing each of these five groups of methods based competencies we have covered the classic processes like specifying objectives and scheduling the execution. In addition we have included processes of increasing importance such as performing various types of project analysis, the process of manning the project, establishing infrastructure for virtual communication, developing the competencies of the project participants, and acting as coach for the project participants.

As mentioned, these various aspects and elements of project management have been included both to create an optimal self-assessment tool - and to influence the focus and thinking of project management in the society.

3. APPLICATIONS OF THE NATIONAL COMPETENCE BASELINE

In addition to implementing the tool in the Danish version of the IPMA 4 Level Certification Programme, the Danish Project Management Association has promoted its utilisation in several other ways:

- The tool is *circulated to managers of major corporations* in the private and public sectors to visualise that the project management profession in the country has crystallised the essential project management competencies.
- The tool is promoted for *internal use in corporation*, where all project managers perform self-assessment of their project management competencies without necessarily continuously following the official certification processes. This application has been supported by an additional internet-based, which gives managers of the companies overview over the current level of project management competencies.
- The tool is used as frame of reference for the next national symposium of project management and the teams of the symposium are selected so that the book published from the symposium primarily will cover competence elements, which are less supported by existing national literature on project management.



Further we are promoting the tool for other applications by corporations and institutions:

- Assessing the project management maturity of a company and specifying the need for further advancements including tailor made training programmes.
- Auditing, reviewing or evaluating the management of current projects in the company.
- Planning the project management effort of a current project or a new period of a project.

4. FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THE NATIONAL COMPETENCE BASELINE

When the development of the tool was nearly finished we signed an agreement with the Swedish Project Management Association, who has now translated and adjusted the tool into a Swedish version. We are also negotiating a similar agreement with the Norwegian Association. Of cause, we are also open to have agreements with other associations and organisations, which want to benefit from our development.

The next step will be to develop an English version of the tool - primarily as a service for Danish and Nordic companies working internationally.

In 2004 we plan to re-develop the National Competence Baseline together with our partners in the Danish Project Management Association. The purpose is to utilise experiences from the application of the tool.

Further we intend to build-in new focus areas of project management since our Association considers the National Competence Baseline to be a living instrument for a proactive influence on the focus of project management in the society.

Code of Conduct PMI Netherlands.

In order to strengthen the professional aspect of project management PMI-Netherlands thought it necessary to introduce a code of conduct to be pursued by its members. On behalf of the Board of PMI-Netherlands a small committee, consisting of three very senior project managers Cees Brouwer (KPN), Margreet Reuvers (Berenschot) and Ruud Vermeulen (Brighthouse), developed a concept code of conduct.

Objective of this code of conduct is to establish a minimum quality in acting professionally. The code of conduct intends to provide clarity in:

The professional attitude of the members of

PMI Nederland towards customers and other persons involved;

The way in which the members of PMI Nederland have contacts with each other. A complaint committee was established in order to supervise the maintenance of the code of conduct.

During the general assembly meeting in March this concept was accepted by the members, provided that this will be applied for a trial period of one year. During this year alterations can be made, on the instigation of one or more members of PMI-Netherlands or on the basis of best practices. In the beginning of 2005 the trial period will be evaluated. Plan



is that the code of conduct will be passed by the general assembly meeting in 2005.
