

# Project Management Association of Japan (PMAJ) Hosting "International Project & Program Management Symposium Tokyo 2008" in March 2008

Project Management Association of Japan (PMAJ) will host the "International Project & Program Management Symposium Tokyo 2008 – in pursuit of organizational project management value" in Tokyo in March 2008.

This international project management symposium is the second to be hosted by PMAJ following the International Project Management Congress Tokyo 2001 (IPMC 2001) in 2001, and will celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Japan's foundation of the professional project management society. The symposium will focus, among others:

- New domains of project management, including program management and portfolio management
- Organizational pursuit of project management value and governance
- Major project cases
- Building the future of project management

The symposium will be organized in collaboration with leaders of the global project management society and will be supported by major Japanese corporations and agencies promoting project management.

PMAJ is national project management association of Japan, born in 2005 thorough the integration of two project management bodies, Japan Project Management Forum (JPMF – pioneer of Japan's project management society) and Project Management Professionals Certification Center (PMCC). PMAJ has 3,000 individual and 110 corporate members from all branches of the Japanese industry and agencies. PMAJ offers its own standard "The Guidebook of Project and Program Management for Enterprise Innovation – P2M" and P2M based certification system.
